Reminder Of Selfless Love


REFLECTION:

We often ask this question or pray this prayer, "Lord, how can I be humble and obedient?" We struggle when we are faced with the answer: through trials and challenges. And then

we remember, the One who is both humble and obedient, Jesus Christ.

Our first reading shows that Jesus is both God and man in one person. He declares truths that gave comfort to the broken and contrite heart, to those weary of sin, and those harassed with afflictions. And with the Holy Spirit, he spoke with courage relying on the help and guidance of God to pray, to preach the gospel, and to receive and obey the will of the Father. God, the Father justified the Son when he accepted the satisfaction he accomplished on the cross, his ultimate sacrifice for the sin of man, for all our sins. Christ speaks on behalf of all believers. He is our friend who we can trust. He is our advocate to the Father, our example of a prayer warrior.

As Pope Francis wrote in his daily meditation entitled "Witnesses to Obedience," "The Cross can not be separated



tian's life is a witness to obedience."

This is our focus as followers of Christ - the love, sacrifice and obedience of Jesus Christ on the cross. The cross is not only a symbol of obedience but is an illustration of love. The Father showed his love for us by sending his son, his only son, from heaven to earth as a replacement for unworthy sinners like us. Jesus' love for the Father caused him to submit and obey his will. Jesus' love for us caused him to sacrifice and die on our behalf. The cross is our reminder - of love, obedience, of selflessness.

"In this, is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins." (1 Jn 4:10) We see such acts of self-denying love as nothing and no one else can ever do. Let us pray and ask God to open our hearts to His will and to give us strength to humbly accept His will in our lives.

The gospel story of the "Agony in the Garden" has once again reminded me of the struggle that Jesus Christ had to go through at that moment in time, knowing full well of what awaits Him. I can only imagine how He is overwhelmed with grief and sorrow with the realization that in order to save mankind, He will have to suffer excruciating pains and had to die on the cross. He must have been stricken with loneliness and the feeling of being alone, not able to receive emotional and spiritual support from people He holds dear. The same strong emotions that we as human beings have all experience at various times in our lives. Feelings that if you are not strong enough can break you.

Jesus is in such agony that He even prayed three times to let this suffering pass Him by. Despite that though, He did not allow this immense feeling to dictate His action but rather, ends all His prayers with these simple words - "Not as I will but as You will". By doing so, He showed us how we should endure our own pain


