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Amidst the Storms

REFLECTION:

In the Gospel reading this Sunday, Jesus rebukes the wind and calms the sea. He was awakened by the disciples because they were afraid, and Jesus asked, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith? This is

the same question that Jesus asks when fear takes hold of and paralyzes us. What are the storms in your life that weigh you down? We all have anxieties and fears and they come from many sources: receiving bad news about our health, family problems, loss of loved ones, or loss of employment and source of livelihood. When these come, we ask, how do I handle these fears? Can I overcome these life -threatening challenges?

The Sign Of The Cross

The divine Trinity takes up his abode in us on the day of our Baptism: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Ĥoly Spirit". Every time we sign ourselves with the sign of the Cross we re-

member God's name in which we were baptized. With regard to the sign of the Cross a theologian, Romano Guardini, remarked: "We do it before praying so that... we may put ourselves spiritually in order; focus thoughts, heart and will on God; after praying, so that what God has given us may remain within us.... It embraces the whole being, body and soul... and everything is consecrated in the name of the Triune God".

The sign of the Cross and the name of the living God therefore contain the proclamation that generates faith and inspires prayer. And just as in the Gospel Jesus promises the Apostles that: "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth" (In 16: 13), so it happens in the Sunday Liturgy, from week to week, when priests dispense the bread of the Word and of the Eucharist. The Holy Curé d'Ars also reminded his faithful of this. "Who welcomed your soul", he asked, "at the beginning of your life? The priest. Who feeds your soul and gives it strength for its journey? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, bathing it one last time in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest, always the priest".

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we lose sight of who He really is. Jesus is Emmanuel "God with us." Because Jesus is in and with us, our apprehension and anxiety are assuaged by His tender comfort and assurance. He helps us to remain calm and be at peace above all understanding as He walks with us through our "storms."

"Have you no faith?" This question of Jesus has a deeper meaning that goes beyond "calming the storms of our life." Trusting Jesus means surrendering our whole being to Him, even if we cannot understand why, and always relying upon His guidance (cf. Prv 3:5-6). Just as Jesus prays not for His

know that Jesus is with us because will, but God's will to be done (cf. Lk 22:42), we should have the same attitude of letting our Sovereign God take control of our lives. This brings about a peaceful rest to our mind and soul. Having complete faith in Jesus and abiding in His will sustain us for eternal life (cf. Jn 3:16) and secure our salvation (Acts 16:31). St. Paul reminds us to put our hope in Christ not only for this life (for healing, peace, joy, understanding, earthly blessings, etc.), but also for the afterlife because of His resurrection (1 Cor 15:19-20). And, as expressed in our promise this week, "They cried to the Lord in their distress...he rescued them," (Ps 107:28)

Prayer:

Lord, nothing in this world can bring us comfort and peace that You alone can offer. Thank you for understanding our trials. You truly care for us. Through our own struggle and pain, help us to be Your vessel to offer comfort and strength to others who need help. Amen.
